## Psychology Department

#### Makerspace

It is a supervised space for work or independent study for students from seventh to ninth grade, in which values such as responsibility, time management, and honesty are reinforced.

#### Inter-generation Committees

### The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

The **Diploma Program of the International Baccalaureate** is an optional program. It is developed during two years, specifically in tenth and eleventh grade of high school. The main objective of this program is to train people with an excellent breadth and depth of knowledge, and hand in hand with physical, intellectual, emotional and ethical growth. Applicants to the IBDiploma will simultaneously receive their National Baccalaureate degree endorsed by the Ministry of Public Education, according to current regulations.

Our students can also opt for the subject certification model, with a minimum of three subjects from the International Baccalaureate Program.

Our students do not need to take an additional yearafter eleventh year to obtain the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

- 9. Complete image consent permissions
- 10. Student record from other institutions, when applicable
- 11. When applicable, a certification of financial records issued by the institution of origin
